What do v. 13-17 tell us about human nature?

What is lacking in all people according to v. 18?

How do you think God feels about the fact that everybody is a sinner and has "turned their back" on him?

If there is time, read Romans 5:6-8.

What is God's solution to our not being 'good enough' to go to heaven?



#### Helping each other

How can this group help each other to understand and respond to God's love?

Is there anything that we must do differently this week in light of our study today?

**IET'S Pray** . Thank God for showing us that he loves us by sending Jesus to die for us.

# The Week ahead



### FOR YOUR EYES ONLY: The Week ahead

#### 1. Have you turned from a life of sin to a relationship with God?

It may be that after this study you now realize that you need to repent of your sins and come into God's Kingdom. If you want to turn and make God the king of your life, there are a few simple things you must do.

- 1. It is very important that you repent of your sins. This means admitting that you have done wrong, asking for forgiveness and turning away from a life without God.
- 2. Here is a simple prayer you can pray: "Dear God, I am sorry for living a life apart from you. I am sorry for all the things I have done that are wrong. Thank you for loving the world so much that you sent your one and only Son. I thank you for his death on the cross for me. I want to now live as a child of yours. Please help me to do this as long as I live. Amen."
- 3. If you do this, God will forgive you completely. Jesus died on the cross for this very reason!
- 4. After you have prayed this prayer, you should tell your Bible study leader. He or she will be really glad to hear this!
- 5. It would also be helpful to read the box below (The Good News is really good!) and read the Bible verses. These verses drive the point home about why the death of Jesus on the cross is so important.
- 6. If you pray this prayer, make sure you keep going to Bible study to learn more about Jesus and how to live the Christian life. Being a Christian isn't simply praying a prayer of forgiveness and then doing what you'd like. Following Jesus must have a big impact on your life. Reading your Bible with other Christians will help you to understand what it means to follow Jesus each day.

#### z. Personal Bible Reading

This week, try to spend some time reading the Bible. You can do one of two things: either read the sections from the Bible dealing with the good news of the gospel (you'll find these in the box at the bottom of this study) or begin to read the gospel of Mark. This is a great book about Jesus and what he's done for us. See if you can read chapters 1-4 this week.

Hot tips for those who are just starting out and have never read the Bible! The Bible is a great book. In fact, it is really a collection of books (66 in all). There are two main sections to the Bible: the Old Testament and the New Testament. The Old Testament was written before Jesus, the New Testament was written after him. It will take you a lifetime to get to know the Bible really well, so be patient. Try and take one section of it (for example, the book of Mark) and spend some time getting to know it well. Read it a few times. Make sure you ask God to help you to understand it each time you read. Keep a notepad handy and write down any questions you have. You can ask these questions to your Bible study leader or

3. Memory Verse

A great way to get to know what the Bible teaches is to memorize Bible verses. Can you learn the memory verse at the top of the study (John 3:16)? Give it a try this week.

your minister when you see him/her. Have fun!

4. Prayer

Spend some time each day thanking God for all the good things He has done for you. Make sure to thank Him for the "good news". That is, the fact that Jesus has died on the cross to pay the price for your sins. Pray for any friends or family that don't know Jesus yet. #### The Good News is really good!

The clear teaching of the New Testament is that we were like "sheep going the wrong direction". However, Jesus died on the cross to pay the penalty for this and to lead us back to God. This is good news! (This good news is often called the "gospel".) There are a number of Bible verses that tell us about the gospel. Here are some for you to read and think about. As you do, you will soon realize why the good news is so good!
